LANDSCAPE MAINTENANCE OPERATORS

1. All chemicals applied to a residential setting must be reported on a monthly summary from, no later than the 10th of the month following the month of application. Use reports and permits must be kept for two (2) years.
2. Employees applying chemicals must be trained prior to handling pesticides. Training must be documented. Forms are available from the Agricultural Commissioner's office.
3. Hazard Communication Program must be explained to employees (A-8 form). Labels and MSDS (Material Safety Data Sheets) of chemicals applied must be kept in a file accessible by employees.
4. Chemicals must be stored in a locked enclosure with a pesticide storage sign posted on the outside readable from a distance of 25 feet.
5. Read all pesticide labels and follow directions prior to applying any pesticide.
6. Comply with all protective clothing requirements on the pesticide label. Regulations always require eye protection and chemical resistant gloves, long pants, long sleeved shirt, shoes and socks, for pesticide applications by employees.
7. Perform all pesticide applications in a manner that will prevent any off site movement of the chemical.
