NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Notice is given that at **6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, April 16, 2025**, in the **City of Yuba City Council Chambers, 1201 Civic Center Boulevard, Yuba City, CA**, the Sutter County Planning Commission will hold a public hearing on the following:

Project #U24-0036 (Lucich) – Entitlements to redesignate 5± acres of a 37.67± acre parcel from Agriculture to Industrial/Commercial. Entitlements include a General Plan Amendment to redesignate 5± acres from Agriculture, 80-acre minimum (AG-80) to Industrial / Commercial (I/C), a Rezone of 5± acres from Agriculture (AG) to Commercial Industrial (CM), and a Use Permit to reduce the agricultural buffer setback; 5411 State Hwy 20, Yuba City, CA 95993; North of State Hwy 20, approximately 340 feet west of Lytle Road; APN: 13-280-021; Applicant/Owner: BC Enterprises LP c/o Bill Lucich (**A Mitigated Negative Declaration is proposed**)
